Journeying with Jesus Through the Gospel of Luke

The VPC church community will be spending the first part of 2019 in the Gospel according to Luke. Our mission at VPC is "to know Christ and to make Christ known." One of the ways we come to know Christ more deeply is to listen to His words and to reflect upon His life. Our ministry leadership is aligning many of our ministries over the first months of 2019 around this congregation-wide effort to go deeper in God's Holy Word. The Sunday messages and Pastor's Bible study will be based on a schedule of readings through Luke.

The daily readings are printed on a bookmark (available at the Welcome Center and the Church Library). Daily

passages will be listed in the Sunday bulletin and on the church website. You can also sign up through Realm to receive a daily reminder of each day's reading from Luke. Each daily reading from Luke will be a very short passage-sometimes only a few verses. This is to allow us to read the section of Scripture slowly (even several times), to consider the words deeply, to listen for God's nudging, and to allow the words to remain with us through the day. If you haven't picked up a Luke Journal, you're also encouraged to use this resource to write your own thoughts, reflections, and prayers alongside the Biblical text.

Gospel of Luke Journals available in the library during regular library hours. Donation is \$5 per journal. Free bookmarks with the list of the daily readings from Luke will also be available for all.







you enjoy traveling, you're invited to be part of a faith-inspiring pilgrimage to Austria, Germany, and the Czech Republic with Pastor Chris and other church friends in the summer of 2020 (June 24-July 4)! The highlight of this 11-day trip will attending the Passion Play in Oberammergau, Germany. This world-renowned production has been presented by the village of Oberammergau every ten years since the 17th century. At the end of the Thirty Years War, the townspeople vowed to enact the Passion story in gratitude to God-and the village has continued this tradition of glorifying God for nearly 400 years. Today, Oberammergau is also known for its souvenir woodcarving and the bright frescoes that adorn its charming Alpine homes and businesses.

Our faith journey will also take us to the Czech city of Prague, where will take a walking tour in the historic footsteps of Jan Hus, one of the leading

figures of the Protestant Reformation; and we will visit the TCM International Institute at Haus Edelweiss, near Vienna, Austria, where VPC supports the education of pastors from across Europe and Central Asia.

As we travel together from Vienna to Salzburg to Oberammergau to Munich to Prague, we will enjoy a cruise on the beautiful Danube; visit churches, castles, historic sites, and cultural centers; and, of course, enjoy good food and friendship together!

We will be having another information meeting for those who may be interested in the trip after worship on Sunday, January 20 (in the chapel). Feel free to come and learn more/ask questions (no obligation to sign-up). A detailed brochure is available at the Narthex Welcome Center, Relatives and friends are welcome to join the pilgrimage! The total cost is \$3599 per person (which includes all land transportation, accommodations, professional tour guides, most meals and admission costs for group activities but exludes airfare). TCM International Institute has about 2,000 students and graduates working in 44 countries across Europe, Central Asia, the Middle East, Africa and beyond. These disciple makers are actively involved in ministry while pursuing their Master of Arts degree or Master of Divinity degree in order to become even more effective in ministry. With its main Mentoring Center Haus Edelweiss located near Vienna, Austria and 23 additional Mentoring Centers throughout Europe

and Central Asia students are able to receive training without traveling the distance to Austria. More than 100 TCM students come from a Muslim background and many are working among Muslim groups. These men and women share the gospel at great risk to themselves. All students are scholarshipped as their standard of living is a fraction of ours and they cannot afford the cost of education. starting in 2019 VPC will scholarship Murat Bagir from Turkey as well as continuing to support Jakob Remmel in his doctorate education. You can help Murat, Jakob and the other students by utilizing the yellow cards to help with their tuition, books and travel expenses.


