Painting Trip to Immokolee



Mission & Outreach

MARCH MONTHLY MISSION PARTNER: Day 4 Hope, July 25, 2020

More than 130 children in the Venice area are homeless. They don't have a nice home, can't visit a fine restaurant, or have travel possibilities. They live in a car, motel or homeless camp. They dine on scraps or fast food. They travel by bike or walk since they don't have any other means of travel. Their clothes are not clean or new but hand-me-downs or from Goodwill. They're not able to wash in a nice bathroom. And more than 1,000 people continue to move to Florida every day, some of whom are in these same circumstances. For the last four years. VPC with Day 4 Hope, has sponsored approximately 120 homeless children per year to prepare them to return to school with new clothes. new shoes, haircut, medical exam, eye exam, dental exam, new backpack filled with school supplies, books, hygiene products and groceries for them and their family - all at no cost to the child or family.

Hope 4 Communities and Day 4 Hope started in 2010, serving 250 children in Sarasota.

Last year VPC served 116 children from four schools: Venice Elementary, Garden Elementary, Laurel Nokomis Elementary, and Taylor Ranch Elementary. Countywide, 2,865 children were served. This year we hope to serve 130 children here at VPC and over 3,000 county-wide. VPC will serve homeless children from eight schools, the same four from last year plus Englewood Elementary, Sky Academy Venice, Sky Academy Englewood and the Montessori school on Pinebrook. How can you help these less fortunate kids? Our Day 4 Hope event will be

held on Saturday, July 25th. Many of you have volunteered in the past and we need your help again. For this one-day event we need over 250 volunteers to help prepare the children, both homeless and those in the greatest need of assistance, for the first day of school. In one day, we attempt to raise their self-esteem so when they walk into school on the first, sometimes frightful day, they feel they are on an equal level with their peers. During the Day each child will be guided around the VPC campus by Ambassadors, so they receive the following:

- A physical exam by a doctor, and county records are checked to insure each child has the proper vaccinations.
- A dental exam by a dentist including a fluoride treatment.
- An eye exam including glasses if needed. Last year the doctor scheduled the most needy cases for a further appointment at no cost. All doctors, nurses and medical support staff donate all their time and resources.
- Haircut by hair stylists who donate their time to cut the child's hair, and maybe even mom's and dad's hair if time permits.
- A new backpack filled to the brim with all the necessary school supplies.
- A bag full of hygiene products.
- Two large bags of healthy, nutritious food.
- A bag of fresh produce from Detwiler's.
- Two hot meals are provided for the entire family, and of course the volunteers. Volunteers will prepare and serve over 600 meals

that day. Most of the food is donated by One Christ Won City, Salvation Army and local merchants.

- Another local vendor brings an ice cream truck with free ice cream.
- A free toy and books are provided to each child.
- The last three years we have given three \$25 gift cards for each child to purchase new clothes and shoes.

In addition, a prayer room for children and parents is available, staffed by Stephen Ministers, as well as a play corner where children can participate in fun activities such as face painting and crafts.

The City of Venice provides two police officers as well as a fire engine and emergency vehicle for the children to explore and enjoy.

Providing all this to these children less fortunate is truly a Day 4 Hope.

Our goal is to serve
130 children. For those

of you who will have

returned up north, we



need your financial help to accomplish this event. It costs over \$100 per child to accomplish this day. For the last four years we have given each child three \$25 gift cards for clothes and shoes. One goal this year is to increase that amount to four \$25 gift cards. We all remember taking children to the store to buy clothes and shoes and even \$75 does not go very far, so we believe it is important to increase our gift card amount to \$100. Altogether we need to raise approximately \$16,000. The doctors, nurses, medical staff, hair stylists and photographer all donate their time, as do the ambassadors and other volunteers.

We hope to see you on Saturday, July 25th.



3 Cents A Meal: Giving your change to make a change!




