The Safety Team is looking out for you while you're on VPC campus, but we still want you to be prepared for anything off campus also.

As you know, we are in the middle of hurricane season with the most active time ahead of us.

Here are some tips from Sarasota County's COAD (Community Organization Active in Disaster):

Build an Emergency Supply Kit – new guidelines say you need to be prepared with 7 days worth of supplies.

To stay safe and ready for any disaster strike, it is important to prepare your family disaster kit by gathering some of the basic supplies. It is also important to place them in a portable container so that you can comfortably carry them in case disaster strikes. Some items that you will want to include are listed below.

- Water—At least 1 gallon daily per person for 7 days.
- Food for 7 days.
- Non perishable & canned foods
- High energy foods like protein bars
- Non electric can opener
- Cooking tools including fuel like Sterno for heating foods
- Plates and utensils
- Pet food & care items
- First Aid Kit
- Medicine/Prescriptions
- Toiletries
- Suitable Clothing—seasonal, rain gear, proper shoes like boots
- Flashlights—with batteries or able to be charged by hand crank

- Radio with batteries or charged by hand crank and include NOAA weather radio
- Disaster Supply Tools—utility knife, whistle, pencil, map compass, thread, needles, signal flare, tape, shut-off wrench, eyewear, thermal blankets

Important Items stored in a waterproof container. Medical records, bank account numbers, social security card, insurance information, telephone with important numbers, cash in case bank ATMs are down, cell phone charger

Your family disaster kit should be placed in an easily accessible place where each family member can reach it and all foodstuffs should be replaced on a regular basis according to it's shelf—life.

The painting and sealing of the Administration Building are some of our last projects. We will now move onto signage for the campus to better identify buildings.

We see a need to provide shade over the patio area outside of the Glasshouse Café. We've engaged a landscape architect to help us find a way to provide that shade. Communion on the Lawn has been a wonderful experience, and we plan to continue providing that opportunity. Updating the patio area will be a great help. We will place new pavers in the patio area the week of September 6th. Work in the Memorial Garden will start soon as well.

We are starting spiritual gifts classes in September. These classes will help you learn about how God wired you. We will give you a Biblical overview of what the Bible defines as Spiritual Gifts, where to find them in the Biblical text, and what that means for you.

I will begin teaching these classes in September. I am so excited to travel this journey with you and help you understand where God might be leading you. We will use the curriculum called Serving from the HEART. We will talk about your STRIDE (Spiritual Gifts, Talents, Resources, Individuality, Dreams, Experiences). You will better understand your top three gifts and how you can use them to glorify God and celebrate how you may already be using them. Enjoy this publication. 
Worship Ministry

Resources for Praying the Psalms

Pastor Chris recommends two resources for going deeper in the Psalms. Both of these books are devotionals, guiding us to pray along with the prayerbook of the Bible (the Psalms). There are many excellent books on the Psalms, but these two are particularly geared towards life-application.

God's Prayer Book: The Power and Pleasure of Praying the Psalms, by Ben Patterson

Patterson (campus pastor of Westmost College in Santa Barbara, CA) gives an excellent introduction to the subject of praying the Psalms, and then offers brief reflections on 62 of the Psalms.



The Songs of Jesus: A Year of Daily Devotions in the Psalms by Timothy and Kathy Keller

This devotional book walks through the entire book of Psalms in one year, with short daily reflections and a prayer.

Praying the Psalms Sermon Series

September concludes the summer of Praying the Psalms Sermon Series.

The Psalms are prayers, expressing a wide range of feelings, longings, hopes, and praises.

Foundations: A Study of the Book of Genesis

Beginning in October, Pastor Chris will lead us through an in-depth, life application study of the first book in the Scriptures. Genesis is not just the first book of the Bible; Genesis is a foundational book for the rest of the Bible – as it lays the foundations for everything that follows.

Pastor Chris will lead us through the opening chapters of Genesis – both in the Sunday morning messages and a Wednesday night Bible study. The Sunday messages will begin on October 3, and the Bible Study will begin on October 6 (each Wednesday evening at 6 pm). All the teachings will be live-streamed and posted on the VPC YouTube channel.

You're encouraged to take notes in your own Bible – and for those who would like them Genesis Scripture Journals (like ones we've used for recent studies of Luke, Acts, and Philippians) will be available for purchase in late-September.

Live Stream Monitor



Another position volunteers may play in the booth is that of 'I ive Stream Monitor', This person has a computer that has a reading of the audio board so they can make adjustments in the live stream. The mix of audio in the sanctuary is different than the mix that is needed in YouTube and on Facebook. Using a set of headphones. the person monitorina the live stream audio

changes the levels to make the perfect mix to send out. Every time a new speaker, singer, or instrumentalist starts they turn the volume up or down so that there is a consistent level coming through to your device. During a hymn, they have to adjust the piano, lead singer, and congregation. The more players involved, the more intricate the work becomes. Just imagine how many channels there are to adjust on mornings with a chancel full of instrumentalists! There are up to 20 channels when we're at full capacity.

This person also keeps an eye on how our output is flowing to our online audience. Sometimes, there are fluctuations in our internet service that cause our live stream to pause, get choppy, or separates the audio from the video. From time to time this person replies to YouTube or Facebook comments - especially if someone is having a problem that we can solve in the moment.

Every volunteer in the booth plays an important part, but this one entails slightly less pressure because the tweaks that they have to make are never going to cause a disruption to the service. This is a great spot for someone who is detail oriented and enjoys listening to music so they can create a beautiful mix of sounds for our online audience.

The DePue Brothers Band encompasses a vivid blend of bluegrass, classical, and rock genres. season. However, we trust the Lord will provide the next person who will shepherd the worship and family ministries and seek to provide worship



services that point you all closer to Jesus Christ. We ask that you pray for us as we will certainly be praying for you. We look forward to these next few months of ministry at VPC. Let us not look at them with sadness and grief, but let us live into them with excitement and joy for all the new things God is leading us to.

Finally, we leave you with this. While it seems that we will no longer be family, know that because of our bond in Jesus Christ, we will be together for all eternity. Missions



The **Center of Hope** is a 501 (C) (3) non-profit organization located In Venice, Florida. The Center of Hope has been a beacon of light serving those who demonstrate a need since 2003. Through donations, grants and partnerships we help those who are experiencing a difficult season in their lives.

The Center of Hope assists -the homeless, veterans, single-parent families the elderly, and the working-class poor by providing a variety of services to help improve the health and economic conditions in our community. The Center of Hope is one of six entry points throughout Sarasota and Manatee counties to provide clothing, housing and fellowship to our local homeless community.

We are able to offer services to the clientele daily based on funding be it a need for non-perishable and perishable food, assistance with rent and utilities, food stamps/Medicaid, legal IDs and referrals, prayer and a host of other things.

We work and partner with many local churches to better serve the people who are living in poverty or experiencing emergency or crisis intervention. The Center of Hope is concerned for our children. Every year we hand out

school supplies, school clothing and Christmas Toys for our families who demonstrate a need.

We've managed to serve outside during the entire COVID



season through the help of generous volunteers and our community at large. This fall, we will be offering expanded hours to reach a population of people who work, but still need services.

We are open Tuesday-Friday 8:00-11:00 am. The Center of Hope Community Outreach Services will be moving its offices to the little house on our property 2355 Shamrock effective August 1, 2021.

September MMP: Mision Peniel

Misión Peniel began as a pastoral ministry of charity and service, providing food, clothing, fellowship and emergency support to farmworkers in Immokalee, Florida in September of 2006. Beginning in 2013. Misión Peniel became a ministry of Peace River Presbytery while continuing to be a vehicle for people of faith to respond to a call for compassionate service to complement the focus on social justice provided so aptly through the Coalition of Immokalee Workers. Under the leadership of Pastor Miguel Estrada, Misión Peniel addresses the isolation and injustice among migrant workers in Immokalee and provides support to them through spiritual and material care. They bring together people of faith and compassion to act with farm workers to achieve fundamental change in their living and working conditions.

Mision Peniel is resuming scheduling of volunteers from churches such as ours beginning in July. Our first trip is planned for Friday, October 15, and

at present only 6 people at a time are needed to help with distribution of food and other items. Everything is being done on a "walk-by" basis, so mission coordinator Ruth DeYoe has asked that any donations of clothing that we collect be pre-sorted and bagged according to size, with 3 tops and 3 bottoms per bag, and labeled--for example: "women's small", with a total of 6 such items inside. Right now there's no room at the mission for storing items in bulk, so everything must be "ready-to-go" as it arrives. Thanks to all of you who are helping out with this mission to serve God's people in greatest need!

Day 4 Hope's mission, working with Hope 4 Communities, is to prepare homeless and under-privileged children to return to school on an equal basis with their peers by giving them a positive attitude and the school supplies needed for a successful school year.

We had a wonderful Day 4 Hope event, serving 184 children in 91 happy families! Colorful balloons, music, friendly waves and smiles welcomed the families as they drove in. and prayers were offered throughout the day, even though we were all masked when interacting with the families to keep all volunteers and families safe from Covid-19. As each family arrived, they received a letter of concern from

VPC and a prayer request card.

Each child received a backpack full of school supplies, a bag of personal care products, 20 pounds of groceries (provided by All Faiths Food Bank) and a bag of fresh fruit (donated by Detwiler's). With the trunk of the vehicle piled full of these items. the next stop was at the Stephen Ministry table where each family received a packet including a Bible, a children's/ family devotional book and other helpful

information. The final stop was at the gift card table where each child received \$100 worth of aift cards to buy clothes and shoes. After the gift card table families had an opportunity to meet with Stephen Ministers for a personal time of prayer. Approximately half of the families received praver. We were blessed with many smiles and thank-yous from family members even a few tears.

THANK YOU to everyone at Venice Presbyterian Church for hosting this event again this year. Thanks to all of you who volunteered your time and energy. Through your financial generosity, we served 184 children in this area. Also, thank you to Grace United Methodist Church and New Life Church, who supported us with financial gifts and volunteers. It costs about \$24.000 to host this event. We also

thank One Christ Won City for the use of tents, and Publix for donating grocery bags and the use of grocery carts.

VPC planned for 200 children this year, whose names we received from the local elementary schools. We placed our order for supplies and aift cards on June 1st. Items must be ordered early because of the timing to receive all the supplies. Invitation letters to families are sent out in mid-June. responses received. then final registration forms are sent out early July. From June 1st to mid-July our total number of children continued to increase. The extra families' names were sent on to Hope 4 Communities so they could be served at another location. Since we had already ordered our supplies including gift cards for 200 children and only 184 attended, we had supplies, groceries, fruit, and gift cards left over. Our remaining backpacks and care bags went to Buddy Break, Center of Hope, and Immokalee Mision Peniel. The extra groceries and fruit went to Community Assistance Ministries (CAM) for distribution to the homeless. The remaining gift cards will be utilized next year.

We cannot host this event every year without a team of dedicated volunteers who give of their time and talents. Bobbie and Richard Gilbert coordinated the processing of children and sending out invitations: Robin Maher-Frost coordinated with the schools in reaching children and families and operated registration; and Bob Jelenchick and Sheryl Morford successfully obtained the supplies and led a team preparing all the backpacks, care bags, groceries and fruit

for the event. These five members of the leadership team went above and beyond in giving of their time and energies. These major areas were supported by the remaining leadership team members and about 60 volunteers, including several teenagers.

As we look forward to Day 4 Hope 2022 (hopefully a normal full event), we realize we have a few vacancies in our leadership staff. If you have an interest in helping these less fortunate children, please contact Cindy or myself.

VPC truly blessed these children this year in difficult and unusual circumstances. We are grateful for every person who worked to make this day a Hopeful one for many less fortunate families.

Find Your Greatest Life Purpose

Life's greatest purpose is simple: to see our descendants in heaven. There is no greater focus for the second half of life than that!

Psalm 78:5,6 gives us a guide for thinking this through. It says, "...he commanded our ancestors to teach their children, so the next generation would know them, even the children yet to be born, and they in turn would tell their children.

We are to think four generations, as this verse mentions: (1) ancestors (God's command was directed to them); (2) children, (3) next generation (not



born), and (4) their children. In other words, we are to have a vision for perpetuating our faith to two generations who are not yet born.

If heaven is really eternal as we believe it is, then having children, grandchildren, and the generations that are not yet born join us there ought to be life's greatest purpose. Yet grandparents often fill their days with work, hobbies, trips, recreation—good things, but not the best thing.

You Play a Vital Part in God's Plan

A friend has been a senior pastor of a large church for over 30 years. He is a recent "convert" to the importance of grandparenting, and now loves to say, "I find such satisfaction in the title, 'Senior Pastor.' But there is a title that is much more important to me. It is 'grandpa."

There simply is no greater focus for the grandparenting years than that of doing all you can to see your descendants join you in heaven. C. S. Lewis said, "Children are not a distraction from the most important work; they are the most important work." Might I modify that and say grandchildren are the most important work? Do you agree? Do your intentional actions show it?

Grandparents, take heart. Never forget: you play a vital part in God's plan to reach emerging generations with the gospel. As you become more purposeful, your grandkids—and the generations beyond them—will benefit greatly!



An important message worth repeating, derived from Pastor Carolyn's Midweek Devotional August 18, 2021

Remember to Love One Another



Today I would like to talk to about living in harmony and loving one another, especially when we don't agree.

But first of all, I wanted to mention that we need to be praying for the people of Haiti who have suffered a devastating 7.2 earthquake this week. You can also make donations for Haiti by giving online and selecting our disaster relief fund or writing a check and put Haiti earthquake on the memo line. This is a concrete way that we can demonstrate the love of Christ. Thank you for your generosity.

We are coming up on the 20th anniversary of 9/11. Can you believe that it's been that long? One of things that sticks in my memory about 9/11 is how unified our country was in the aftermath. We didn't identify ourselves by our political party or whether we were liberal or conservative. We were all just Americans.

Not so anymore. We live in a fractured, fragmented culture that is increasingly polarized. Everything is divided along partisan lines – democrat, republican; liberal, conservative. We find it impossible to have civil conversations about the problems that plague us and politicize everything, even issues of morality that come straight from the Word of God. We don't even try to understand each other, but instead, we demonize and vilify anyone who does not agree with us.

It almost seems as if it's something in the air we breathe or the water we drink – there is so much fear and anxiety, so much hostility and hatred. In fact it is the enemy of our souls seeking to devour us by inciting us to turn on each other.

The controversy du jour is to be vaccinated or not, to wear masks or not. And all the variations on what we should or should not do with regard to the corona virus.

Most people want to do the right thing. Most have legitimate reasons for their decisions on vaccinating or not, masking or not.

Let's understand that there are people with expert credentials who point out scientific evidence to support their particular views on both sides of the fence.

And everyone also has his/her particular set of health variables that must be considered in our decisions.

Each of us must do what we need to do to stay as healthy as we can given our particular life and health situation.

We also need to respect and love others who do not make the same choices we would.

Of course, some express their hostility in passive aggressive ways. One husband said to his wife, "Whenever I get mad at you, you never seem to get upset...How do you manage to control your temper?" The wife responded, "I just go and clean the toilet." With a puzzled look on his face, the husband said, "How does that help?" The wife clears up his confusion saying, "I use your toothbrush." Seriously, as Christians, we have a tremendous opportunity to demonstrate the light and love of Christ in this world by respecting one another, even, and especially, in discussions about difficult and potentially divisive issues.

But so far, we've not been very good at it, and church history, with the proliferation of denominations provides ample evidence of this, in spite of Jesus' prayer for us to be brought to complete unity.

Nowadays, prominent Christian leaders slay each other publicly in social media, on television and in print. This is profoundly troubling, and certainly detrimental to the witness of Christ in the world. Who would want to be part of a group of people who rip each other to shreds?

My brothers and sisters, this ought not be so!

Jesus Christ only has ONE church and all believers will spend eternity together – with Him AND with each other, regardless of our differences here on earth.

And, here on earth, as the hands and feet and mouth of Christ in reconciling the world to himself, we should be the first to lay our weapons down. The first to set aside the destructive weapons of this world and challenge the principalities and powers of evil using spiritual weapons of righteousness. And the greatest of these is love.

Love truly is the answer. This is not just a trite saying. It is the very truth of God. It is the very character of God. It is the very heart of God.

The Apostle John records that at the Last Supper, Jesus said, (*John 13:34-35*)³⁴ I give you a new commandment,

that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

So, let's each do three things:

Do what you need to do to be vigilant about caring for your health and that of your family given your life situation.

Always trust our Sovereign God & Father, knowing He is in control regardless of how things may appear. We walk by faith and not by sight. The delta variant did not take God by surprise. He didn't go, "Man, I didn't see that coming!"

Let's Love one another. Love offers grace and mercy, protects the other's good name, trusts the other's intentions, hopes for the other's good will, and always perseveres in bridging the gap of understanding. Love never gives up trying.

St. Francis of Assisi captures it so beautifully:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace,

Where there is hatred, let me sow love; Where there is injury, pardon; Where there is doubt, faith; Where there is despair, hope; Where there is darkness, light; Where there is sadness, joy;


O Divine Master, Grant that I may not so much seek To be consoled as to console; To be understood as to understand; To be loved as to love.
